(2) Asymptomatic elevations of hepatic transaminase have been reported; may recur upon rechallenge. Monitoring is recommended and discontinuation may be necessary. Cassipa™ should only be used after induction and stabilization of the patient, and the patient has been titrated to a dose of 16 mg buprenorphine using another marketed product.</p> <p><b>DOSAGE FORMS AND STRENGTHS</b> Sublingual film: 16 mg buprenorphine with 4 mg naloxone.</p> <p><b>CONTRAINDICATIONS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hypersensitivity to buprenorphine or naloxone.</li> </ul> <p><b>WARNINGS AND PRECAUTIONS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Addiction, abuse, and misuse:</b> Buprenorphine can be abused in a similar manner to other opioids. Monitor patients for conditions indicative of diversion or progression of opioid dependence and addictive behaviors. Multiple refills should not be prescribed early in treatment or without appropriate patient follow-up visits.</li> <li>• <b>Respiratory depression:</b> Life threatening respiratory depression and death have occurred in association with buprenorphine use. Warn patients of the potential danger of self-administration of benzodiazepines or other CNS depressants while under treatment with Cassipa™.</li> <li>• <b>Unintentional pediatric exposure:</b> Advise patients to store Cassipa™ safely out of the sight and reach of children. Buprenorphine can cause severe, possibly fatal, respiratory depression in children.</li> <li>• <b>Neonatal opioid withdrawal syndrome (NOWS):</b> NOWS is an expected and treatable outcome of prolonged use of opioids during pregnancy.</li> <li>• <b>Adrenal insufficiency:</b> If diagnosed, treat with physiologic replacement of corticosteroids, and wean patient off of the opioid.</li> </ul>

Cassipa™ is not appropriate as an analgesic.</li> </ul> <p><b>ADVERSE REACTIONS</b></p> <p>Most common adverse reactions: oral hypoesthesia, glossodynia, oral mucosal erythema, headache, nausea, vomiting, hyperhidrosis, constipation, signs and symptoms of withdrawal, insomnia, pain, and peripheral edema.</p> <p><b>DRUG INTERACTIONS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Benzodiazepines:</b> Use caution in prescribing Cassipa™ for patients receiving benzodiazepines or other CNS depressants and warn patients against concomitant self-administration/misuse.</li> <li>• <b>CYP3A4 Inhibitors and Inducers:</b> Monitor patients starting or ending CYP3A4 inhibitors or inducers for potential over- or under-dosing.</li> <li>• <b>Antiretrovirals:</b> Patients who are on chronic buprenorphine treatment should have their dose monitored if NNRTIs are added to their treatment regimen. Monitor patients taking buprenorphine and atazanavir with and without ritonavir. Dose reduction of buprenorphine may be warranted.</li> </ul>

(2) Macular edema, including cystoid macular edema, has been reported; use caution in patients with aphakia, pseudophakia who have a torn posterior lens capsule, or known risk factors for macular edema.
